### **What is the New England Environmental Justice Forum?**

The New England EJ Forum connects community activists, residents, EJ advocates, lawyers, scholars, and policymakers from all six New England States who are interested in the environment and public health in low income communities and communities of color. We are working to create a structured way for people in New England to come together, share ideas, and learn from one another. The Forum brought together more than 100 people in 2011 at Regional Trainings in Boston and Hartford, and more than 200 people in 2012 at the EJ Summit in Worcester.

### **What is the New England EJ Summit?**

It is an event for discussion, community-building, and learning. Please see the agenda to the right for additional details. Two key focal points of the EJ Summit will be climate disruption / climate justice and sustaining a multigenerational EJ movement. Materials will be distributed in English and Spanish.
